STUDENT EXCHANGE DAYS "MALIGNANI- PRESEREN - KOPER" (31st March and 17th April 2015) RECAP SHEET (summary of all students' comments)

Express your general impression of the day spent together. Why was it worth? Any curiosity?

It was surely an interesting day, very different from the usual school time. I enjoyed meeting new friends and having a good time with them. It is exciting to get to know teenagers like me who speak another language. English was our lingua franca and we succeeded in communicating with words and gestures. The Slovenian and the Austrian, who come from small schools (about 400 pupils) were very impressed by the huge size of ISIS Malignani and they liked the school tour organized by the Italian students. The quality we like best in human beings are intelligence, generosity and happiness.

We suggest longer exchanges: two or three days instead of only one.
